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**POLITICS OF IMMANENCE:
NEGRI OR THE GOOD USE OF SPINOZA.**

The thought of Antonio Negri most of the time is related to political philosophy, but central to his thought is also his reflection on ontology. In this perspective, his reading of Spinoza's philosophy in *The savage anomaly* has a crucial role, because it offers the general ontological schema that will underpin the reflections contained in some of his later works like *Empire* or *Multitude*. Through an analysis of the crucial points of this particular interpretation of Spinoza's philosophy, firstly I will show how it presents the foundation for a new political subject central for Negri's project in general. Secondly I will expose the underlying ambiguities of this reading and against it I will propose an interpretation of Spinoza's ontology in the perspective of the process of individuation that underlies it.

About Andrea Chiarenza: Philosophy student, he is graduating at the University of Turin with a Master's thesis on the process of individuation in Spinoza's philosophy under the supervision of prof. Ugazio. His main research interests are: the philosophy of Spinoza, contemporary French philosophy (especially Foucault and Simondon) and Italian Theory.
